Meeting was called to order by the Mayor at 3:05 p.m.

PURPOSE

OF MEETING:

To discuss possibility of having some of the Town's Debt written down by the Department of Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

Mr. Warren advised that this is the last year that Debt Relief will be offered by the Department and in fact the program is slated to be discontinued March 31, 2005 (at the end of the current fiscal year).

The department has taken a look at our finances over the past few years and have done up what they consider a realistic program to try and clear up some of the long term debt. At the current time the outstanding principle is approximately \$115,000 with arrears of approximately \$750,000. Dept. of MAPA will recommend that approximately \$500,000 be written off with approx. \$375,000 refinanced through N.M.F.M. over a period of 10 years with yearly payments in the range of \$64,000.

In order for this to be done, Council would have to implement Government criteria for taxes over the next three (3) years as follows:

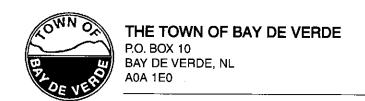

Mr. Warren also advised that this year refinancing would be done through N.M.F.C. but next year or further down the road Council thinks it can get a better interest rate through one of the banks, the option would be there for refinancing this way. Payments would then be as set out through the bank. Current interest rate through N.M.F.C. Is 12%

Advantages of going with Debt Relief Program:

- Will allow for good cash flow
- Will see a surplus for Council at the end of the year
- Will make council eligible to apply for Capital Funding for Infrastructure money

Payments will be made in two installments - most likely June and December. Deadline for decisions: End of February, 2005 - sooner if possible.
